**"AN ORDER ESTABLISHING THE BALAY SILANGAN IN THE CITY OF ISABELA, BASILAN  
AND CREATING ITS TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP"**

**WHEREAS**, Republic Act No. 9165, or the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002, as amended, underscores the imperative to address the pervasive issue of illegal drug use and trafficking in our communities and likewise provides that the Dangerous Drugs Board be the policy-making and strategy-formulating body in the field of drug prevention and control;

**WHEREAS**, Section 84 (a) of the Act provides for the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency to: "Implement or cause the efficient and effective implementation of the national drug control strategy formulated by the Board thereby carrying out a national anti-drug campaign program which shall include drug law enforcement, control, and prevention campaign with the assistance of concerned government agencies";

**WHEREAS**, Section 84 (q) of the Act states that the PDEA may enlist the assistance of any departments, bureaus, offices, agencies, or instrumentalities of the government, including government-owned and/or controlled corporations, in the anti-illegal drugs drive;

**WHEREAS**, the effective implementation of the Act requires concerted efforts and collaborative action among various stakeholders, including local government units (LGUs), to curb the proliferation of illegal drugs and safeguard the welfare of our citizens;

**WHEREAS**, DDB Regulation No. 3, Series of 2022, aimed at enhancing the Balay Silangan Reformation Program (BSRP), a community-based initiative for the reformation and rehabilitation of drug offenders, while repealing Board Regulation No. 2, Series of 2018;

**WHEREAS**, the establishment of a Technical Working Group (TWG) dedicated to the objectives outlined in RA 9165 and DDB Board Regulation No. 3, Series of 2022, will facilitate the formulation, implementation, and monitoring of programs and interventions geared towards drug prevention, rehabilitation, and law enforcement;

**WHEREAS**, in consideration of drug personalities who voluntarily surrendered in the city as a result of the government revitalized campaign against the Philippine Drug Problem, the LGU of Isabela has been enlivened to lobby for the establishment of the Balay Silangan which is an LGU-led program designed to provide a family-based in-house reformation for drug offenders;



**WHEREAS**, the City Government recognizes its duty to uphold public safety and welfare, to actively engage in initiatives aimed at combating the drug menace and fostering a drug-free environment;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, SITTI DJALIA A. TURABIN-HATAMAN**, City Mayor of Isabela, Basilan, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby designate the LGU Community Drug Rehabilitation Center located at Barangay Baluno, Isabela City, Basilan as the Balay Silangan for the City of Isabela:

**SECTION 1. RATIONALE.** Bahay Silangan is conceptualized as a Reformation Center designed to provide family-based in-house reformation for drug offenders by allowing every institution in the community to be involved as part of the shared social and corporate responsibility in addressing the threat of illegal drug abuse.

The Balay Silangan Reformation Center operates in the spirit of volunteerism without expenses being incurred on the part of the patients as well as the government and its instrumentalities. It sustains its existence through the support from the corporate community and civic-spirited/cause-oriented groups.

**SECTION 2. ESTABLISHMENT/DESIGNATION OF BALAY SILANGAN.** The Balay Silangan of the City of Isabela shall be temporarily designated at the LGU Community-Based Drug Rehabilitation Center located at Barangay Baluno, Isabela City, Basilan.

**SECTION 1. CREATION OF THE BALAY SILANGAN LGU TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP.** There is hereby established a Balay Silangan Technical Working Group, hereinafter referred to as the "TWG," which shall be composed of representatives from relevant offices, agencies, and stakeholders within the locality, to wit:

## **SECTION 2. ROLES DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE BALAY SILANGAN TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP:**

1. The Balay Silangan Focal Person and TWG shall maintain and operationalize that Balay Silangan in coordination with the Philippine National Police – Isabela City Police Station (PNP-ICPS) and the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency – Isabela City Office (PDEA-ICO) and in consonance with the guidelines issued by the Dangerous Drugs Board (DDB).
2. The TWG shall be tasked with formulating, coordinating, and implementing comprehensive strategies, programs, and projects in support of the objectives outlined in RA 9165, DDB Board Regulation No. 3, Series of 2022, and other subsequent policies, rules, and regulations regarding the implementation of Balay Silangan Reformation Center in the City of Isabela.
3. Section 9 of the Board Regulation No. 3 series of 2022, states the Roles of Various Agencies of the following:
  - a. **Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency**
    - i. Orientation on the BSRP
    - ii. Orientation on RA 9165
    - iii. Information Campaign on BSRP
    - iv. Provide Subject-Matter-Expert/Resource Person
    - v. Approval of Program of Instructions (POIs) for the training of BSRC Personnel
    - vi. Approval of POIs for the BSRC Clients
    - vii. Ensure the participation of stakeholders in the program implementation
  - b. **Anti-Drug Abuse Council**
    - i. Development/adoption of POI for training of BSRC personnel
    - ii. Development/adoption of POI for BSRC clients
    - iii. Capacitate BSRC personnel in coordination with PDEA and other concerned institutions
    - iv. Allocate funding and/or resources for BSRP operationalization
    - v. Establish BSRC and manage the program
    - vi. Facilitate forging partnership with all concerned stakeholders
    - vii. Address health concerns of program beneficiaries
    - viii. Establish BSRC and manage the program
    - ix. Facilitate forging partnership with all concerned stakeholders
    - x. Address health concerns of program beneficiaries

- c. **Philippine National Police and Armed Forces of the Philippines**
  - i. Provide assistance in the BSRP as requested
  - ii. Provide Subject-Matter-Expert
- d. **DSWD and other local social welfare offices**
  - i. Assessment of the efficacy and efficiency of the BSRP
  - ii. Social services for program beneficiaries and their immediate families
  - iii. Capacitate the BSRC personnel
- e. **TESDA/DTI/DOLE/DA**
  - i. Provide additional resources or support for program implementation, employment, and livelihood opportunities
- f. **DEPED/CHED**
  - i. Education of program beneficiaries

**SECTION 3. SCOPE AND LIMITATION** The Dangerous Drug Board Regulation (DDB) No. 3 Series of 2022 provides guidelines for the Bahay Silangan functions:

- a. Qualified pushers who voluntarily surrendered to authorities and plea bargainers for violation of RA 9165 who are not eligible to be admitted in a Department of Health (DOH) operated and/or accredited Drug Abuse Treatment and Rehabilitation Facility; Community Based Drug Rehabilitation Program (CBDRP); and General Intervention (GI).
- b. The Reformatory Program is a process of rectifying or modifying negative attitude and behavior to enable a person to be more productive and acceptable to enable the person to be more productive and acceptable to society. This also includes facilitating the reintegration of the individual back to his family and community.

**SECTION 4. BALAY SILANGAN REFORMATION PROGRAM (BSRP) COMPONENT AND COMPLETION.** – The pushers and plea bargainers enrolled in the BSRP shall undergo a three (3) months reformation program which includes one (1) month of mandatory in-house Education, Health, Psychosocial, and Physical Activities and two (2) months of Livelihood or Employment Education phase.

The facility head shall issue a certificate of completion of the BSRP to Reformists who are considered graduates after having completed the Education, Health, Psychosocial, Physical Activities, Livelihood, and/or Employment Education.

**SECTION 5. FUNDING.** The LGU shall allocate funds to defray operation expenses relative to the conduct of interventions and other activities.

**SECTION 6. PENALTY FOR NON-COMPLIANCE/VIOLATION.** Failure of the concerned official to perform their function in accordance with the provisions of this Board Regulation shall be grounds for filing appropriate charges pursuant to Section 60 of the Local Government Code and Section 32 of RA 9165.

**SECTION 7. REPEALING CLAUSE.**

All executive orders, issuances, and other decrees that are not in conformity with this Executive Order are hereby superseded and repealed accordingly.

**SECTION 8. EFFECTIVITY.**

This shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
