EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 023

“AN ORDER INSTITUTIONALIZING THE WHOLE-OF-NATION APPROACH IN ATTAINING INCLUSIVE AND SUSTAINABLE PEACE, CREATING A CITY TASK FORCE TO END LOCAL ARMED CONFLICT (CTF-ELAC) IN THE CITY OF ISABELA, BASILAN AND ADOPTING THE NATIONAL PEACE FRAMEWORK”

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 16 series of 2017 adopted the National Security Policy 2017-2022, which calls for the end of all armed threats in the Philippines and recognizes that internal socio-political stability rests upon healing the rifts that divide the nation by promoting participatory governance, synergy of government development efforts, and enhancing the participation and responsibilities of local government units (LGUs);

WHEREAS, one of the objectives of the Philippine Development Plan 2023- 2028 is to attain inclusive and sustainable peace through intensified development and other peace-building initiatives in conflict-affected and -vulnerable communities,

WHEREAS, the Whole-of-Nation approach addresses the root causes of insurgencies, internal disturbances and tensions, and other armed conflicts and threats by prioritizing and harmonizing the delivery of basic services and social development packages by the government, facilitating societal inclusivity, and ensuring active participation of all sectors of the society in the pursuit of the country's peace agenda;

WHEREAS, in support of E.O. 70 of the National Government and EO. 26 s. 2020 of the Provincial Government of Basilan, the realization of the collective aspirations of the Basileños people to attain sustainable peace and to warrant efficient and effective implementation of the Whole-of-Nation approach in the Province of Basilan, there is a need for the creation of a City Task Force to End Local Armed Conflict (CTF-ELAC);

NOW THEREFORE, by the power vested in me by law, I, **SITTI DJALIA A. TURABIN-HATAMAN**, Mayor of Isabela City, Basilan Province do hereby order that:

SECTION 1. INSTITUTIONALIZING THE WHOLE-OF-NATION APPROACH AT THE CITY LEVEL. The Whole-of-Nation Approach is hereby institutionalized as a government policy in the City of Isabela for the attainment of inclusive and sustainable peace in the city. Towards this end, the city shall prioritize and harmonize the delivery of the basic services and social development packages in the conflict-affected areas and vulnerable communities, facilitate societal inclusivity, and ensure active participation of all sectors of society in the pursuit of the city's peace agenda.

A) POWERS AND FUNCTIONS

- 1) Formulate and implement in coordination with relevant national government agencies, Civil Society Organizations, and other stakeholders, for a whole-nation approach-driven peace framework;
- 2) Ensure inter-agency convergence in the implementation of the framework in conflict-affected and vulnerable communities;
- 3) Enlist the assistance of any department, bureau, office, agency, or instrumentality of the government, including, Government-owned or controlled corporations and state, universities, and colleges (SUCs), in accordance with their respective mandates in the implementation of the Framework;
- 4) Evaluate, define, modify, or integrate policies, programs, and activities contained in the framework;
- 5) Organize, ad hoc inter-agency and multi-sectoral clusters, councils, communities, and groups in the city or modify existing ones, whenever necessary, to fulfill its mandates;
- 6) Develop strategic communication, advocacy, and peace constituent plans in case of ceasefire, as well as capacity-building measures, to enable local chief executives and local peace bodies to engage and facilitate local engagements or negotiations and interventions;



- 7) Review the mandates and functions of offices undertaking peace efforts to avoid duplication of functions and programs and submit its recommendation/s to the Governor for approval;
- 8) As may be necessary, issue supplemental guidelines, subject to the provisions of the General Appropriations Act; and for approval;
- 9) Perform such functions as may be directed by the chairperson.

SECTION 3. CREATION OF THE CITY TASK FORCE – END LOCAL ARMED CONFLICT SECRETARIAT. to provide technical provision and management of the plan, workgroup under Task Force, a secretariat is likewise created to be composed of the following:

- A) DUTIES AND FUNCTION OF THE CTF-SECRETARIAT.** Provide technical and effective administrative support and assistance to the Task Force in the performance of its task, coordinate with relevant agencies on the status of its plans and programs, and provide updates to the Task Force on the implementation of the Framework.

SECTION 4. CITY PEACE FRAMEWORK. The framework shall contain, policies and programs that will bring inclusive sustainable peace and address the root cause of insurgencies. Internal disturbances and tension as well as other armed conflicts and threats identified areas. The framework shall be responsive to local needs and sensitive to realities on the ground. To this end, the Framework shall include a mechanism for

localized peace engagements or negotiations and interventions that are nationally orchestrated, directed, and supervised, while being locally implemented.

SECTION 5. CONVERGENCE. All departments, bureaus, offices, agencies, or instrumentalities of the government, including GOCCs, SUCs, and Barangay Government Units are hereby advised to render the necessary support to the task force based on Executive Order No. 70 of the President of the Philippines.

The private sector, non-government organizations, and other stakeholders are encouraged to participate in all peace-building programs, plans, and activities, in the implementation of the framework.


SECTION 6. FUNDING. The funding requirements for the implementation of this order shall be charged against existing appropriations of member agencies of the Task Force, the peace and order fund, and such appropriate funding sources as the local finance committee may identify, and when necessary, the Contingent Fund, subject relevant laws, rules, and regulations.

This succeeding year's appropriations for the operation of the plan and the secretariat shall be included in the budget proposal of the Office of the Mayor. The funding requirement for the implementation of the programs, plans, and activities in the Framework shall be included in the respective annual budgets of the concerned agencies, subject to the usual budget preparation process.

SECTION 5- REPEALING CLAUSE. All executive orders, rules and regulations, and other issuances, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY. This order shall take effect immediately upon approval.
